Overview

As County Scouts Team Leader, you'll help shape the County Scout programme, making sure it's exciting, inclusive and supports the priorities and outcomes of the national 2026–2035 strategy.

Purpose: Working in partnership with other county programme team members, you'll support and empower Scout leaders across the County, helping them deliver high-quality programme experiences in Troops. You'll also act as a champion for Scouts, sharing insight from local delivery and helping to shape national priorities

Main Contacts: County Team Lead for Programme, County Team Leaders within the programme team, District Squirrel Team leads and members

Time Commitment: Very flexible, typically 2-3 hours a week

Terms of Appointment: Role requires a Disclosure check to be completed, and mandatory online training needs to be completed as part of this role within the first few months, which will help you understand your role and the aims of The Scouts.

Expenses: All out of pocket expenses will be reimbursed.
